



### How do we know if the Bible is real?

There is, for instance, physical evidence. We have copies of the manuscripts and throughout history these copies show that the Bible has been transmitted accurately. Despite common skeptical claims that the Bible has often been changed through the centuries, the physical evidence tells another story.

The Bible's truth is supported by its manuscript reliability, with over 5,700 Greek New Testament manuscripts and thousands more in other languages. It is validated by archaeological discoveries (e.g., the Tel Dan Stela, Pilate Stone), over 300 fulfilled prophecies, internal consistency among 40+ authors over 1,500 years, and the historical evidence of the resurrection.

#### Key Evidences for the Bible's Truth:

- **Archaeological & Historical Accuracy:** Discoveries have consistently confirmed, rather than discredited, biblical accounts, such as the existence of King David and Pontius Pilate.
- **Manuscript Evidence:** The Bible has a massive number of ancient copies, with the New Testament supported by 23,000+ total manuscripts in various languages.
- **Fulfilled Prophecy:** Numerous prophecies in the Old Testament, particularly concerning the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, were fulfilled.
- **Internal Consistency:** Despite having over 40 authors, spanning 1,500 years and multiple genres, the Bible maintains a unified, coherent theme.
- **Testimony of Jesus:** Jesus affirmed the divine authority and reliability of the Old Testament.
- **Life-Changing Impact:** The Bible continues to transform lives, which many view as evidence of its divine nature.

For many, the ultimate confirmation of the Bible's truth comes from experiencing its message as the Word of God, as stated in **2 Timothy 3:16**.

**2 Timothy 3:16** states, "*All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness*". This foundational Christian verse highlights that the Bible is *divinely inspired, serving as the authoritative guide for doctrine, conviction of error, and instruction on how to live a godly life.*

### **Key Aspects of 2 Timothy 3:16**

- **"God-breathed" (Theopneustos):** The Greek term indicates that Scripture originates from God Himself, carrying His authority and breath, rather than being merely human invention.
- **Comprehensive Utility:** Scripture is practical and profitable for four main areas of spiritual maturity:
  - **Teaching:** Establishing sound doctrine and truth.
  - **Reproof/Conviction:** Pointing out errors in belief or behavior.
  - **Correction:** Providing the path to fix mistakes and restore righteousness.
  - **Training in Righteousness:** Guiding daily life and spiritual growth.
- **Purpose:** The goal is that the believer is equipped, complete, and prepared for every good work.

While often referring to the Old Testament at the time of writing, this verse is broadly applied to the entire canon of Scripture as divinely authoritative.
